On another beautiful Sunday afternoon, rival Cal-Mum made the 7 mile trek down Route 5, as the Junior Knights played their first game at the newly renovated Hartwood Park. Coming off their best team defensive game of the year, the Knights defense continued their dominance while being led by a balanced offensive attack.

Cal-Mum won the toss and deferred, giving LeRoy the ball to start the game. A 5 yard penalty by the defense gave LeRoy 1st & 5 at the 40 yard line. Runs of 10 yards by Luke Lathan, 4 yards by Adam Woodworth, 3 yards by Jude Sherman and 4 yards by Woodworth sandwiched a second offsides on the defense. This set up 2nd & 6 at the 34 yard line. LeRoy's left side, featuring Aaric Luce, Jace Jedrewski & Jake Higgins, opened a gaping hole for Jude Sherman to burst through on his way to a 34 yard touchdown run. Luke Lathan powered in the extra point for an early 8-0 lead.

On Cal-Mum's first possession, Jack Egeling, Luke Lathan and Wyatt Draper all made plays at or behind the line of scrimmage

forcing a 4th and 12. Cal-Mum chose to punt the ball away giving LeRoy possession at their 47.

A balanced, up tempo, 9 play drive featuring runs by Luke Lathan, Adam Woodworth and Jake Higgins set up LeRoy at the 2 yard line. DJ O'Geen, Wyatt Draper and Grady Gilligan opened up the right side allowing Adam Woodworth to walk untouched into the end zone. LeRoy 14 – Cal-Mum 0.

LeRoy's defense led by Aaric Luce, Joey Reschke, Andrew Davis and DJ O'Geen again forced a three and out after three plays for negative vardage. After a Cal-Mum punt, LeRoy took over at Cal-Mum's 47 yard line to begin the second quarter.

LeRoy's next drive featured the four-headed monster of Lathan, Sherman, Woodworth and Higgins as all four contributed with runs taking the ball down to the 2 yard line, where Luke Lathan finished off an 8 play drive to make the score 20 – 0 LeRoy.

It took only one play for Le-Roy's defense to get the ball back as Holden Sullivan and Jack Egeling burst through the line, almost taking the handoff, to of the year. Final Score LeRoy force a fumble that was recovered by Holden Sullivan.

One play later, LeRoy converted a turnover into points. Le-Roy's second wave of offensive linemen, Brandon Shirley, Gaven Myers, Nick Noble, Cameron Wilson, Austin Bogue, Connor "CC" Corcimiglia & Drake Schwab, got in on the action executing their blocking assignments perfectly, as Jude Sherman burst through a huge hole to race 31 vards for his second touchdown of the day. Halftime Score - LeRoy 26 - Cal-Mum 0.

LeRoy's defense did not allow a 26-0 halftime score to impact their effort in the second half. 32 different LeRov defenders teamed up to allow only 3 yards on 17 carries by the Red Raiders over the final two quarters.

The final touchdown of the game came after LeRoy's defense gave the offense the ball at Cal-Mum's 10 yard line. Behind textbook blocks by Brandon Shirley and Gaven Myers, Connor Elmore got free around the left end and sprinted untouched into the end zone for his first touchdown

32 - Cal-Mum 0.

LeRov's defense was led by Jack Egeling with 11 tackles including 4 for a loss & Holden Sullivan with 6 tackles, 5 for a loss and a fumble recovery. Luke Lathan recorded 5 tackles and a fumble recovery. Andrew Davis, Aaric Luce, Jude Sherman each with 3 tackles. Adam Woodworth with 2 tackles. Wyatt Draper, Connor Elmore, Noah Kaczanowski, Cameron Maxwell. Alex Spezzano and Cole Tonzi, each with 1 tackle.

LeRoy's offense was powered by Jude Sherman with 4 carries for 70 yards and 2 TD's followed by Adam Woodworth with 7 carries for 42 yards and a TD, Connor Elmore with 7 carries for 42 yards and a TD, Luke Lathan with 7 carries for 41 yards and a TD, Jake Higgins with 5 carries for 35 yards, Noah Kaczanowski with 2 carries for 31 vards and Joey Reschke with 3 carries for 4 yards.

### LE ROY PENNYSAVER & NEWS - OCTOBER 2, 2016 George Cory's Light

A couple of days before the Oatka Festival, I was told that the firemen had installed a light to shine on the Soldier's Monument on Trigon Park. I had hoped to get an article in the Pennysaver, but the time got ahead of me. They told me that the light was installed in memory of George Cory. I suspect that some of you remember George. He was an electrician in LeRoy. He installed the electrical boxes on Trigon Park when more electricity was needed for the food booths for the Oatka Festival. He was our electrician at LeRoy House for many years. I remember the day I pulled out some very old light bulbs to show him. With a funny grin on his face, he said, "Let's try them." "Isn't that dangerous?" "No, not at all," and he screwed the old bulb into the socket and turned the switch. Sure enough, the light bulb was bright, and I can still see his face when the coils lit up. He was just like a kid, fascinated with that light bulb.

George was a proud member of the LeRoy Excelsior Hook and Ladder Company. He had served as their President. He also served as the Fire Police Captain, and was always first to a fire to set up the safety line. I remember him in his crisp white firemen's shirt, usually directing traffic during the Oatka Festival. George always wanted

to put lights on the Soldier's Monument. But he never had the chance and George died in 2003. But the members of the Excelsior Hook and Ladder Company remembered George's plans for the monument and thought there was no better way to remember George than to install the lights. George's wife, Jane, thought it was a wonderful idea, so on Friday night, July 16, the firemen gathered with Mrs. Cory and George's son, to officially turn on the lights. This fall as it gets darker earlier in the evening, it's easy to see how wonderful the Soldier's Monument looks. I know George is smiling.

The Soldiers' Monument was finally completed in May, 1906 after many years of planning. Although it commemorates soldiers from the Revolution and the War of 1812, it was primarily a project initiated by the members of the Grand Army of the Republic, to commemorate those who had served in the War of the Rebellion, known today as the Civil War. In fact if you read the bronze plaque for the Civil War veterans, it is labeled "War of Rebellion."

The Union soldier is made of bronze and was designed by Rudolph Schwartz. He is 7 feet tall and stands on a 13 foot plinth of Barre granite. The granite is carved with crossed swords and a laurel wreath. Each cor-



ner has a carved canon. On the west side is a canon and palm branch. The east side had a bugle and oak wreath. The south side has a musket and canteen and cartridge box.

As I was reading about the ceremony in 1906, I thought it was appropriate for George Cory, that on the day that the statue was dedicated, the Excelsior Hook and Ladder Company was in attendance and they had invited the members of the Attica Hooks to be their guests. The firemen – many who had served in the Civil War, were part of the

10,000 people who assembled in LeRoy that day.

Like many things that we take for granted in our busy lives, it is easy to overlook the landmarks that are unique to our community. Not just on Memorial Day, with the speeches and the gun salute, but every day, let this monument remind us of those who have fought and preserved our liberty and the American way of life. And thank you to the Hook and Ladder Company, for making this happen.









### Le ROY PENNYSAVER & NEWS - OCTOBER 2, 2016 LeRoy Senior Football LeRoy 14 Cal-Mum 0

Playing for the first time at the new and improved Hartwood Park, the LeRoy Senior squad dominated the Cam-Mum Red Raiders, winning 14-0 in the annual Route 5 rivalry game.

Cal-Mum won the toss and elected to defer until the 2nd half. LeRoy started with the ball around midfield after a kick return. Only 4 plays later, following a crushing block by Tony Piazza, Drew Strollo scampered 40 yards for a highlight reel TD, giving the Knights the early lead. For the 2-point conversion, Tommy Condidorio hit Ryan Higgins, who made a diving catch in the back of the end zone, to extend the lead to 8-0 only 2 minutes into the game.

Cal-Mum's first possession ended quickly when Jackson Fix intercepted a pass only a few plays into the drive. Fix, Drew Strollo, and Riley Williams would carry the ball, moving the chains initially. However a block in the back and sack would end the drive prematurely, giving the ball back to the Red Raiders.

Consecutive tackles for loss by Drew Strollo and then Ryan Higgins would force a punt to begin the second quarter. Start-

ing at around midfield again, the Knights methodically moved the chains with a balance of inside and outside running and passing. Completions by Condidorio to Jackson Fix and Higgins would put the Knights inside the 10 yard line. Behind excellent blocking from Hunter Beverly and Tristian Jones, Strollo would dart into the end zone for a 7 yard TD. After a failed conversion attempt the Knights led 14-0. The defense would hold again, shutting down the Cal-Mum offense behind good pass defense led by safety Kyle Northrup, as time for the first half expired.

After a nice kick return by Cal-Mum to begin the second half, the Knights defense once again delivered thundering blows. Ryan Higgins engulfed a runner for a big loss on 3rd down, followed by a sack by Connor Hegeman to force the turnover on downs.

The Knights offense would then takeover on offense and begin a long drive that would chew up the entire 3rdquarter and more. Following excellent blocking by Joey Biletskiy, Tristen Wieseltier, Iaien Frawley, Zach Tooley, Aiden Davis, Bryce Lathan, and Josh Horner, Ryan Higgins led the backfield charge with multiple big gains. When Cal-Mum adjusted to address the smashmouth football style, efficient QB Tommy Condidorio hit Adrian Stephens and Drew Strollo with passes to bring the ball to the goal line. However after a busted play and some excellent Cal-Mum defense, the Knights failed to score, giving the ball back to the Red Raiders.

Forcing a quick punt, the Knights got the ball back quickly. However a surprising slew of penalties were called on the Knights after a well-disciplined first 3 quarters, pushing them back significantly. A fumble would give the ball to Cal-Mum, however 3 consecutive tackles by Hunter Beverly, a sack by Drew Strollo, and an incomplete pass would end the game, giving the Knights the 14-0 shutout over their arch rivals.

Many different Knights made tackles for loss in the defensive battle. Defensive ends Ryan Higgins (4 including 2 for loss), Riley Williams (4), and Connor Hegeman (4 including a sack) held the edge making it difficult for Cal-Mum to get going. Drew Strollo had 8 total tackles including 4 for loss and a sack. Other defenders with multiple tackles were Bryce Lathan (3), Hunter Beverly (3), and Jackson Fix (2) who also had a sideline toe-tapping interception. Tristian Jones, Antonio Martinez, Zach Tooley, and Xavien Walker also made tackles for the Knights.

The Knights used a balanced offensive attack to move the ball all day long. QB Tommy Condidorio hit all 5 of his passes for 56 yards, including a 2-point conversion. Drew Strollo had 173 all-purpose yards (113 rushing, 45 return, 15 receiving) to pace the Knights offense including 2 TDs. Jackson Fix ran for 25 yards and had 17 yards receiving. Ryan Higgins bruised tacklers for 32 yards rushing and also caught 2 balls for 13 yards and a 2-point conversion. Adrian Stephens caught a pass for 11 yards, while Riley Williams and Tony Piazza helped move the chains blocking and running the ball.

The Knights battle York in York on Sunday October 2nd in another crucial divisional matchup.
