





board oversees the education of students and is responsible for school district operations, but does not directly run the district's day-to-day operations, which is the responsibility of the superintendent and the administrative team.





Senator Ranzenhofer's Monthly Column: January, 2017

Top 5 Legislative Priorities for New Year Build Upon Progress

For decades, the State of New York was plagued by late state budgets, out-of-control spikes in spending, and skyrocketing property taxes. More recently, a number of steps have been taken to end these fiscally irresponsible practices, in an effort to make New York more affordable.

The start of a new year and a new session of the State Legislature is an opportunity to build upon this progress. That is why I am eager to get to work on my top legislative priorities for this year.

Bring ridesharing to Western New York. While transportation network companies, such as Uber and Lyft, are available to New York City residents, Upstate New Yorkers have been left behind. Thousands of residents have joined me in urging Governor Cuomo and my Senate and Assembly colleagues to pass this legislation.

Provide real relief for small businesses. Over the past six years, 78 different tax cuts have saved taxpayers over \$11.3 bil-The manufacturing tax rate is at the lowest level since 1917, while the corporate tax has been reduced to rates not seen since 1968. Yet, New York still ranks at the bottom for business climate. In order to create jobs, there needs to be more focus on cutting taxes, as well as repealing burdensome and costly regulations for small businesses.

Enact a permanent state spending cap into law. Since 2010, six on-time budgets have restricted spending growth at or

below two percent, saving taxpayers a cumulative \$31 billion. A long-lasting limit on expenditures protects taxpayers by allowing them to keep more of their hard-earned dollars. Although the State Senate has passed this proposal, it still needs the approval of the State Assembly and Governor to become law.

Make the property tax cap permanent. First enacted in 2011, the property tax cap has stopped more than \$15 billion in tax increases for homeowners. Simply put, it is working. In 2015, it was extended for another five years. The property tax cap further protect taxpayers, and it should be made permanent.

No more pensions for convicted politicians. I have been advocating for an amendment to the

State Constitution that would strip pensions from elected officials convicted of corruption. Those who betray the trust should not be allowed to collect taxpayer-funded pensions. I voted to end the practice, and it passed the State Legislature in 2016. In order to amend the Constitution, the joint resolution has to be passed again this year, then approved by voters through a referendum.

From expanding ridesharing services to our region to chipping away at the tax burden, each one of these initiatives will help create a brighter and more prosperous future for residents in our community. I will be sure to keep you posted on my efforts.



I Don't Know



It's hard to admit that you don't know. Especially if it's your job to know. I've been doing this history business for quite a long time, and I've learned a lot. I'm always fascinated with all the LeRoy history. Jell-O, Ingham University, stringless beans, Lapp insulators, salt, - - the list is pretty long. Le-Roy has some interesting people - Captain Ganson, Charles Wilbor; Jacob and Charlotte LeRoy, Emily and Marietta Ingham, Calvin Keeney, Pearle Wait, Orator Woodward, I have written about all this fascinating stuff each week in the Pennysaver. But for all the stuff I have learned, there's a lot I still don't know. How come I have never found a bottle of Zowie -- the beverage made by Jell-O? How did Pearle Wait pronounce his first name? Why did Jacob LeRoy move back to New York City and what happened to him? What really happened to the airplane, the Friendship, after Donald Woodward sold it?

Why can't we find any art done by Phineas Staunton's sister. who was the first art teacher at Ingham University? Where is the key to the Lampson vault? Why does the west wall of Le-Roy House go up and down? What happened to Daniel Mc-Donald, the conductor on the Underground Railroad? Why is the front door of LeRoy House centered on the outside, but not on the inside? Why don't we know what Charlotte LeRoy looked like? What did Jacob LeRoy and his brother-in-law, Daniel Webster talk about? Was Caroline LeRoy really as unattractive as people thought? Why don't they make Jell-O 1-2-3 anymore? Is the millstone in the back yard really from the old LeRoy mill? When did people start calling LeRoy LeeeeRoy? Am I the only one who really cares?

It is frustrating when someone comes in to do research, and after looking through the files, you have to

admit, "I don't know. I can't find anything." We have file drawers filled with information and hundreds of books, and shelves with boxes of archival material, and you'd think that somewhere there would be a clue to a question. But sometimes you come up empty handed. People are looking for information about their ancestors, or their grandparents. They want to know when their house was built or what it looked like when the porch was on it. Others want to know if their house is haunted. "I don't know." Sometimes people want to know how much something is worth - an old Jell-O book – a family heirloom. Even if I have an idea of how much it might be worth, it is not ethical for me to say. I am not a qualified appraiser so "I don't know" is the right answer.

It's important to understand that it's better to say "I don't know" than to make up an answer. I tell that to all the people who work at the museum - either in the LeRoy House or the Jell-O Gallery. I worked at another museum where there was a fellow, who took "educated guesses" to explain things he didn't know about. But he didn't say that he didn't know the answer, or that he was mak-

ing an educated guess. He just made up answers as he went along. So I've always given people permission to say "I don't know." You don't need to know all the answers.

So the question is - ----"Why aren't you a member of the Historical Society?" You like to read all the articles in the Pennysaver. You are glad the Historical Society offers programs for students at the Wolcott Street School. though it's been a while since you've stepped foot inside LeRoy House, you're glad the Historical Society is taking care of it. You even enjoy stopping by the Historical Society tent at the Oatka Festival to play some games or to buy a Jell-O t-shirt. So, "I don't know" isn't the right answer to that question. This week, you have a chance to change all of that. Become a member. It's not expensive. It's easy. You receive four newsletters each year, with interesting history articles. In the meantime, I'll keep looking for the answers to all the other questions.




